- At least 90% of its NAV in Islamic deposits as well as Islamic money market instruments which have a remaining maturity period of not more than 365 days; and
- Up to 10% of its NAV in Shariah-compliant permitted investments (listed below) which have a remaining maturity period of more than 365 days but less than 732 days.

- · Want a portfolio of investments that adhere to Shariah principles;
- Require a high level of liquidity;
- · Have a short-term investment horizon of 1-year and below; and
- Have a low tolerance for risk.

FUND MANAGER'S COMMENTARY

- In March, the US Federal Reserve maintained its current monetary policy stance, keeping the federal funds rate unchanged at 4.25%-4.5%. The
 Fed's minutes from the previous meeting noted that inflation is still high, but the economy and job market are strong. The US GDP forecast for
 2025 was revised slightly downward to 1.7%, due to growing concerns about economic challenges.
- The European Central Bank (ECB) has reduced its three key interest rates by 25 basis points. This decision aligns with the ECB's commitment to stabilizing inflation at its medium-term target of 2%.
- In the commodity markets, crude oil prices saw marginal fluctuations. Brent crude rose by 2.1%, closing at USD74.74 per barrel end March (USD73.18/barrel end February), while WTI crude settled at USD 71.48 per barrel end March (USD69.76/barrel end February). Global economic uncertainty, particularly in major economies, has significantly impact oil demand and expectations about future supply and demand.
- Meanwhile, the Malaysian ringgit appreciated by 0.62% against the U.S. dollar, ending March at 4.4350, amidst intensifying market talks on the impact of the United States' (US) tariff on the global economy. Despite the volatility, ringgit is deemed the third best-performing currency on a year-to-date basis, suggests that traders and investors are still constructive about the Malaysian economy prospect.
